PSYCHOEDUCATIONAL ASSESSMENT - Incl. GATE PROGRAM - 2021

Approach

Your child may be struggling with school work or there may be behavior concerns that impact their ability to function effectively. Sometimes a child is not performing at grade level expectations or performing above grade level expectations and might be gifted. Your child may have difficulties with boredom, attention and focus or difficulty with emotional regulation. Doing a psychoeducational assessment to understand those factors that impact on your child's learning, and can have significant benefits throughout their school years.

Process

The comprehensive psychoeducational assessment process takes approximately 10-12 hours to complete. It consists of an initial meeting, standardized assessment, scoring, analysis, interpretation, report writing and a debrief meeting. During the feedback session, we discuss the results, and answer your questions or concerns to come up with a comprehensive plan to move forward. Parents typically choose to share the formal report with their school and family doctor or pediatrician.

The goal is to create a better understanding of your child's specific needs, to have purposeful and timely intervention. The report can be used to develop your child's IPP (Individualized Personal Plan), have access to extra support, differentiated programming and academic accommodations. This is especially applicable where there is a specific learning disorder, ADHD, giftedness or during PAT (Provincial Achievement Tests) or Grade twelve diploma exams.

Post-secondary students may also use psychoeducational assessment reports to apply for required accommodations for their respective programs.

Cost

The flat rate includes professional fees and all assessment instruments, questionnaires, checklists and educational hand-outs.
